### *Suggested criteria*

<b>Content</b>	<p>The writing thoroughly addresses the topic/prompt.</p> <p>There is a clear, thoughtful thesis statement.</p> <p>There is ample evidence and strong reasoning to support the thesis.</p>	<p>The writing addresses the topic/prompt.</p> <p>There is a complete thesis statement.</p> <p>There is sufficient evidence and reasoning to support the thesis, but they may be lacking some development.</p>	<p>The writing attempts to address the topic/prompt.</p> <p>While a main idea is present, there may not be a clear thesis statement.</p> <p>There are some details to support the main idea, but they could be significantly more numerous, reasoned, and/or developed.</p>	<p>The writing barely addresses the topic/prompt, or the writing does not address the topic/prompt at all.</p>
